66.3% of Probation Orders terminated during the period displayed a decrease in LSIR score. (This is based on 86 terminations; there were a total of 132 in the period, the remainder being either score pending or marked as '99').

Basic skills

13 clients have received tutor support up to 30/9/15, with a total of 46 tutor sessions being delivered. A greater number of clients have been seen but less sessions delivered than last year, with some clients only having one or two. Two clients successfully passed their driving theory following assistance from their tutor and one client has progressed on to the Second Chance programme run by Highlands College.

Restorative Justice

There has been RJ officer involvement in relation to 45 clients across the spectrum of supervision types, slightly up on last year (43), with 30 referrals being made. Work undertaken includes 8 Restorative Justice Conferences, 15 face to face apologies and 3 letters of apology, with 1 offender carrying out work for their victim in order to make amends. 15 RJ victim sessions were undertaken at the prison.
